POLICY

- Bags and Venues Update (Mr. Link)
 - No bags larger than 8 inches x 4 inches x 6 inches unless approved by staff
 - All bags are subject to search
- Policy 218 <u>Student Discipline</u> (Dr. Stoker)
 - NL's policy was last revised in 2007.
 - Policy 218 is a mandated policy
 - Language regarding off-campus activities was revised to clarify the circumstances under which the Code of Student Conduct and board policy applies to student behavior that occurs both on and off-campus. Such

circumstances include off-campus student conduct that:

- Involves, threatens or makes more likely violence, use of force or other serious harm directed at students, staff or the school environment;
- Materially and substantially disrupts or interferes with the school environment or educational process;
- Interferes with or threatens to interfere with the rights of students or staff or the safe and orderly operation of the school and school programs;
- Involves theft or vandalism of school property; or
- The proximity, timing or motive for the conduct or related factors establish a direct connection to attendance at school, to the school community, or to a school-sponsored activity.
- Updated to include language on reports to the threat assessment team.
- Policy 227 <u>Controlled Substances / Paraphernalia</u> (Dr. Stoker)
 - NL's policy was last revised in 2004.
 - Policy 227 is recommended by PSBA for legal liability purposes.
 - The off-campus activities section in this policy was revised to refer to Policy 218, Student Discipline, which is where school administrators should be directed when considering consequences for a student's conduct that occurred off school property or during nonschool hours.
 - First, second, third violations were removed as the law can be referenced under <u>Act 93 of 1989</u>
 - A reference to Policy 236, Student Assistance Program, was also added to the policy.
