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**Peters Elementary School (K-2) Transition Plan
Updated: July 13, 2022**

Purpose: The purpose of this plan is to create a seamless transition for students and families entering kindergarten at Peters Elementary School as well as second graders transitioning to attend Slatington Elementary School as third graders.

Action Steps

Pre-kindergarten into kindergarten

- Develop and maintain ongoing partnerships with faculty from the Peters Elementary School, Head Start, and other local Early Childhood Providers. By establishing open communications with these partners, the district obtains vital academic and behavior information regarding incoming kindergarten students
- Implemented ongoing early intervention meetings with the director of special education and a core team to determine the needs of incoming kindergarten students with disabilities. Beginning in February, individual family meetings are held with a director of special education and the school's psychologist.
- Kindergarten registration is held in April as well as in the summer months. In order to reach families with young children, announcements are placed on the district's website, in local newspapers, and flyers are distributed at the Slatington Library and other local community organizations.
- During Kindergarten registration, children are administered a School Readiness Screener to determine their need for intervention upon entering Kindergarten. Families may also receive a "Bulldog Bag," which is filled with activities and supplies to promote kindergarten readiness.
- During the month of August, family members and their children are invited to attend a Kindergarten orientation night. Students ride the school bus and spend time in their classroom in an effort to ease difficult transitions. Parents also have the opportunity to meet the teacher to discuss policies, procedures, etc.
- Implement social-emotional activities and/or curricula from Kindergarten to Grade 2 to teach necessary social skills that lead to success in kindergarten.

- Kindergarten students are administered the following assessments three times a year: DIBELS Next, and Imagine Math. The results from these benchmark assessment tests determine Readiness skills as well as interventions that are needed to ensure student success. Kindergarten and first-grade teachers meet to discuss students' progress and concerns.

Second Grade into Third Grade

- Prior to the end of the year, second and third-grade teachers have an opportunity to meet and discuss students' progress and concerns.
- At the end of the year, second-grade students are provided with a guided tour of Slatington Elementary.
- Throughout the summer, families are able to schedule a tour the building, if needed.
- At the beginning of the school year, a third-grade Meet the Teachers night is held. Families are able to tour the building, meet the teachers, and discuss policies, procedures, etc.
